

Season of Lent

The season of Lent begins on March 2. During Lent, we embark on a spiritual journey that enables us to grow into a deeper and richer relationship with God. God desires to be in a close and loving relationship with each one of us, as we open our hearts to Him. During this season, let us draw near to the cross of Jesus Christ, more fully accepting God's forgiveness and renewing power, especially as we continue to face difficult world problems.

Our **Lent devotional guide** for this year is entitled "Drawn to the Cross" and includes inspiration from one of the most beloved spiritual thinkers of the 20th century, Henri Nouwen. He encourages us to draw closer to the cross of Christ by understanding more deeply the meaning of the cross in terms of humility, service and sacrifice.

The devotional booklets will be available at the Ash Wednesday service on March 2 at 5:00 pm, and at worship on the first Sunday of Lent (March 6). If you would like for us to mail a booklet to your home, please call the church office (510-483-2772).



Ash Wednesday – March 2

We plan to gather in the Sanctuary at **5:00 pm**, for a brief service of worship to begin the season of Lent. The children and youth will be joining us as a part of their WOW and Peak program, and all church family members are invited! Devotional booklets for all ages will be available.

During the service, we will receive ashes on our foreheads as a reminder of our brokenness and sin. Traditionally, the ashes used on Ash Wednesday come from burning palm branches that were used on Palm Sunday the previous year. The minister places ashes on one's forehead in the shape of a cross, representing our sin and desire to repent. As Lent begins, we confess our sins and remember that Jesus gave his life for our salvation.



We remember these words from Genesis 3:19 – *“For dust you are, and to dust you will return.”* Our earthly bodies are not eternal. Yet in Jesus Christ, we are restored and given eternal life with God. Our sins are forgiven, and we are reunited with Christ forever. Although we are dust, on Ash Wednesday we are reminded of the greatest miracle of all: in Jesus' hands, that dust lives on. Our earthly bodies suffer from wear and tear, but our inward selves are renewed and given permanent residence in God's kingdom.

Update on Worship and Church Activities

We are thankful that our church family members have taken the important step of being safe and loving our neighbors, by being fully vaccinated and boosted against the Covid virus. We are also happy to see so many of you coming to worship, wearing upgraded masks which provide better protection, as well as spreading out in the sanctuary.

Although the state of California has relaxed their mask requirements, we plan to continue to wear masks at all times while in the church building. We look forward to the time when we can resume Coffee Fellowship and other adult activities, as the case counts and hospitalizations decrease in our county.

Meanwhile, the Session has decided that with the improved masks that most of you are wearing, it is safe for all to participate in the unison prayers and responses during worship. We will continue to have the hymns sung on our behalf by Richard Jackson, Bob Kraut and Leland Morine in the Chancel area.

We are blessed to have our Chancel Choir carefully rehearsing and recording weekly anthems, which are being played during worship. And we are delighted to have our Chancel Bells play in our worship service, from time to time.

The members taking attendance in the Narthex each week prior to worship have additional N95 and KN95 masks available, so just ask them if you have not yet received one.


Manna Meals may be purchased at any time during office hours, and they will be for sale as soon as we resume our Sunday morning Coffee Fellowship time.




Food Support for Our Neighbors
