Celebrating Pentecost, The Birthday of the Church

After the resurrection, before Jesus returned to Heaven, He told His followers "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." (Acts 1:4-5)

God sent the gift of the Holy Spirit to His people on the day of Pentecost. The Holy Spirit helped God's people to tell others about Jesus. It didn't even matter if they spoke the same language or not. They told others about Jesus and they understood. Thousands of people came to know Jesus on Pentecost and began the very first church, making Pentecost the birthday of the Church.

This year, **Sunday, May 28**, is Pentecost Sunday and everyone is encouraged to wear RED, the color of Pentecost. Faye Wilson will once again be coordinating the reading of scripture in many different languages within the morning worship service. Our Church will also be participating in the Presbyterian Church (USA) Pentecost Offering that is used for children at risk and for ministry with youth and young adults. Our congregation will keep 40 percent of the offering for use here, and send the remainder to Presbytery and General Assembly for their use.



Following worship, we will also make and enjoy Pentecost Sundaes during Coffee Fellowship, as we celebrate the birthday of the Church.


talented staff and leaders."

attend a training prior to the week of Daycamp.


