## Have you experienced Wet N' Wild Wednesdays yet?



Wet N' Wild Wednesdays are for ALL ages children, youth, parents, grandparents and any other adults of any age, after all we are all Children of God! Wet N' Wild Wednesdays take place from 4:30 – 7:30 pm. They began on June 14 and will end on July 12. That means there are only two more Wet N' Wild Wednesdays this month. So be sure to join us on July 5 and/or 12!

The activities each week are based on a different Wet N' Wild Wednesdays N' Wild Bible Miracle. This month's miracles are The Pool at Bethesda (July 5) and Peter Walking on Water was previously publicized.

(July 12). From 4:30 – 5:15 pm participants rotate freely through CREATE, LEARN and EXPLORE stations. ## What does a transitional pastor do?

It used to be that the period between the departing pastor and the arriving one was filled with "pulpit supply," because often the in-between times were short, and mostly filled by retired clergy.

These days, interim or transitional pastors come with an array of skills and options. As we get started together, I want to share with you a few of my roles:

- **Stabilizer.** I am around to do the usual things that pastors do preach, teach, visit the sick, coordinate staff and committees.
- **Consultant.** Particularly when I first arrive, I am new enough to ask the question, "Why do you do it that way?" I see things from an outsider's point of view, and can offer some ways of looking at the congregation that might not have been considered. We will look at a variety of things at the church in the coming months, and together keep the things that work or adjust as needed.

**Coach.** As we identify the work that is being considered for our time together, I play the role of a coach in helping staff, committees and other groups. Sometimes I'll do this to complete specific things (the Mission Study) or in working with ongoing committees.

Transformational Leader. As I play the above roles, I'll be asking the question of us all, "What is God asking of this congregation?" One thing I want to be really clear about – we work in partnership on all of these areas. Both the transitional pastor and congregation have work to do during this important period.

If there is one piece that I think we will spend time on, it is probably around identity, because many protestant congregations are finding that the old ways of being church together need some updating, and some new patterns and ways of thinking about themselves need to be identified. We will look at how God might be calling this congregation to become "new wineskins" in order to reach a changed culture outside of our doors.

All of these are done according to need (we don't need to fix that which is not broken), because each congregation is unique in its history, culture, and point of starting. My hope is that we incorporate the work into the life of the congregation, and use the church year and events that happen as ways of looking at these tasks, so we don't wear ourselves out adding a lot of work on to already busy schedules. They also are not necessarily done in straight successive order – a single activity may incorporate aspects of several.

We have work ahead of us, and I am confident, and trust that with your abilities to discern and talk honestly, and with God's providence, we will do this work well with one another in the coming months.

#### YouthWorks Returns to the SF Bay Area and to First Presbyterian

Many of you know and remember that prior to the pandemic, YouthWorks (a Christian organization providing mission trip opportunities for teens) used our

church facility as a summer "home base" for mission trips that came to the SF Bay Area to serve. Sadly, the pandemic prevented these types of mission trips for the past few years. Fortunately, YouthWorks survived the pandemic and like so many ministry organizations, they are re-imagining mission and ministry!

This summer YouthWorks is offering more customizable mission trip experiences where groups choose locations based on their church/organization needs. When a church group from Colorado requested to come to the SF Bay Area, YouthWorks reached out and asked if this group of 13 youth and 2 adults could stay at our church. Our Session enthusiastically responded YES! So later this month, we will be opening our church as a "home" away from home for this group from Colorado. They will be here from July 23 – July 28. Each day they will be serving

different organizations or agencies throughout the Bay Area and enjoying a different ethnic dinner out each evening. They will sleep at our church each night and use the church kitchen to prepare breakfast to be eaten before they leave for the day, and bag lunches to take with them.

We are excited to once again be able to open up our church to house those serving our greater community. Additionally, we are grateful to Bob and Jane Kraut who will serve as the point people for the group while they are here.

## **Building Futures**

Thank you to everyone who so generously contributed to the Move-In Kit that we were able to assemble and give to the Building Futures organization. Members of our congregation contributed over \$800 to buy items needed for a local family to get started in their own living space after experiencing homelessness. The items included a bed with pillows, linen and a comforter set, a microwave oven, dishes, cups and silverware, cleaning materials, and basic health and beauty supplies. The Kit was delivered to Building Futures in mid-June, so someone is already enjoying the comfort of a new home using the basic supplies we provided. We can be sure that the recipient will feel your love and, through you, the love and grace of God.
