

Lent: Full to the BrimBeginning with Ash Wednesday Service on February 14th

The traditional iterations of the liturgical season of Lent often emphasize restraint, confession, and piety. Often people will talk about what they are "giving up" for Lent – sometimes alcohol, or sweets, or some bad habit. The origins of Lent in the early church were that one was to leave their old life behind to fast and prepare to be baptized into a new way of living. In essence, this was a practice of stepping away from the rat race, corrupt power, scarcity mentality, and empty rituals in order to live a more expansive and full life of faith.

We, the people who have largely already experienced baptism and new life in Jesus come to Lent with a bit of tension – we have experienced some of that new life already – but perhaps not in full. We are people of the promise who are still finding our way – sometimes messing up and having to course correct our lives, sometimes we are figuring out the next steps in the call of God on our lives. Lent provides us with some space for reflection on where we have come from, and what God invites us into.



Ash Wednesday - February 14 Simple Soup Supper & Service

We'll begin our Lent season with a simple soup **supper at 6:00 pm** served in Fellowship Hall, followed by a brief **worship service at 6:45 pm** in the Sanctuary. Our worship will include the imposition of ashes on our forehead and singing by the Chancel Choir.

All are welcome to the supper and worship service, or simply attend the worship service. Please, sign up in Fellowship Hall to attend the free supper.

Our theme for Lent this year is "Full to the Brim." This theme will help us to trust in the promise of our baptisms, for God has already claimed us as God's own and nothing we can do will ever change or erase that. Full to the Brim doesn't ignore or deny sin and suffering. It doesn't absolve accountability for wrongdoing. Instead, it contextualizes our faith. If love is our beginning, how can we live our lives led by love's promises? It reminds us to live fully - as we pursue justice and hope, or express grief and gratitude.

And so, this Lent, let us trust - fully - that we belong to God. Let us increase our capacity to receive and give grace. Let us discover once more the expansive life God dreams for us.

To help you further explore and experience the Abundance & Fullness of our Lenten theme "Full to the Brim" we will be offering both a Lent Bible Study and Daily Lent Devotional/Prayer emails.

A Full to the Brim Bible Study guide will be available at church beginning on Ash Wednesday. The guide contains a weekly Bible Study to help you further explore the Sunday morning sermon text through reflection, questions and life application. You may choose to take and use the guide at home for individual study throughout Lent or better yet, increase your connections within our church community (see the article titled Session Plans for 2024 on the last page of this newsletter) by participating in any of the three Group Bible Study opportunities listed below as you reflect, share and discuss each study with others in a small group setting.

- Sunday Study at 11 am in the Fireside Room Literally fill your cup at Coffee Fellowship then
 figuratively fill your heart & soul Full to the Brim
 through study and fellowship in the Fireside Room.
- Wednesday Night Simple Soup Supper & Study 6 pm in Fellowship Hall - Literally fill your bowl and stomach with bread and soup while enjoying fellowship around the table. Then figuratively fill your heart and soul Full to the Brim through study and deeper fellowship at the table.
- Zoom (Day & Time TBD) Fill a cup with your favorite beverage at home then virtually fill your heart & soul Full to the Brim through study and fellowship via Zoom.

All three Bible Study group opportunities will use the same Bible Study guide so you are welcome to participate in whichever group best fits your schedule each week. Please sign up ahead of time, especially if you plan to participate in the Wednesday Night Simple Soup Supper Study or the Zoom Group so that we can be sure to set a seat at the table for you or send you the Zoom link.

Additionally there will be a sign up in Fellowship Hall throughout the month of February for those who would like to provide a pot of Soup, or help in the kitchen with set up, serving and/or clean up for one or more of the Wednesday Night Simple Soup Suppers. If you are willing to help in any of these ways, please sign up!

As well as the Full to the Brim Bible Study guide, you may sign up to receive a Full to the Brim Daily Devotional & Prayer email from the church throughout Lent. Beginning on Ash Wednesday and continuing through Easter Sunday, you will receive a daily email in your inbox with an Abundance and Fullness Reminder for the Day and a Prayer. Use these emails as a personal devotional and/or a journaling prompt each day.

Women's Weekend at Westminster Woods is a time and place for all women to rest and reflect, celebrate and sing, contemplate and lament, and be in community with one another. As we reckon with the current brokenness in our world, we retreat not to 'escape,' but to root ourselves in Grace so we may reach out with the same grace to others.

The weekend will be led this year by Rev. Dr. Sandy Tice, who first came to The Woods in 1978, and returned every summer for 40 years. Sandy is a Teaching Elder in the PCUSA, and was pastor of First Presbyterian Church of San Bernardino. She retired last summer and now lives in Pasadena, with her husband Tom Rennard and their dog Charlie. Sandy earned her MDiv at Fuller Seminary and her Doctor of Ministry at SFTS. She also received a Diploma in Spiritual Direction from Mercy Center and is a Certificated Forest Guide through the Association of Nature & Forest Therapy. Sandy loves cooking, hand weaving, and long conversations with friends. She also loves trees, and does much of her praying outside these days.

Through inspirational speaker time and experiential worship Sandy will help the group to embody Christ's Love in Action. Using the image of the redwood forest as a guide, participants will explore biblical texts, prayer, and lived experience in order to hear God's invitation to flourish and grow.

Session Plans for 2024

On Saturday, January 13, the Session met for a half-day retreat at the church to do some training and make some plans for 2024. Out of the review of the CAT survey results and what it tells us about First Presbyterian, the Session plans to focus on two goals. The first one is our primary goal:

 Increasing the connections within our church community. The CAT survey noted that having the congregation become more unified around the mission of the church should be a long-term goal for a thriving church. We will be working to have various gatherings that will offer meaningful conversations and connections, along with fun stuff as well. One elder noted that we will be able to go forward together if we know and trust each other.

Our second goal:

2. Experimenting with ways to increase our visibility to the local community – through events, opening our doors, and signage. One piece of the feedback we received in the community interviews that the Mission Study team has been conducting is that the exterior of the church is just blank – there are no signs of life from the street view of our church except for Sunday morning worship.

Another work in progress is that we are streamlining our Session structure. In the past, there have been more committees than elders which has resulted in elders serving on two committees. We are moving to five Session Teams for 2024: Mission, Congregational Life, Administration, Worship and Education, so that each Elder will now only serve on one team.

Graduating High School Senior Scholarships

For some 30-odd years, our church has awarded scholarships to graduating high school seniors. This scholarship recognizes Christian commitment and encourages further education in students who have been active in the ministries of our church. It is awarded based on each individual's level of church activity, the length of time they have been active at the church, and the depth of their personal Christian commitment. Students must complete an application and provide a letter of recommendation to be considered by the Scholarship Committee. Each applicant must also meet with the Scholarship Committee for an interview to discuss their individual Christian faith, church involvement, and educational goals.
