## Special Worship Services in April



### Holy Humor Worship Service - Sunday, April 7

This service will be full of brightness, joy and fun. This is still a worship service, but one that will put a little bounce in your step and warm your heart. Invite a friend to join in the holy hilarity! The likelihood of the unexpected will be high.

Holy Humor Sunday has its roots in a number of different Christian traditions, dating back to the 15th century. The Sunday after Easter was first celebrated in Bavaria as Risus Paschalis ('God's Joke,' or 'the Easter laugh'). Priests would deliberately include amusing stories and jokes in their sermons in an attempt to make the faithful laugh. After the service, people would gather together to play practical jokes on one another and tell funny stories. It was their way of celebrating the resurrection of Christ – the supreme joke God played on Satan by raising Jesus from the dead.

## Creation Celebration Worship Service and Plant Exchange on Sunday April 21!

*Celebrating God's good creation here on earth*

On **April 21**, we will have a service that we're calling Creation Celebration – a service that affirms a traditional theological notion – the goodness of creation by God the Creator. We'll focus on the beauty of the earth and our roles as stewards of this good creation, and how we can live into those roles through prayer and action.



Following the worship service, we will have a Plant Exchange in Fellowship Hall during Coffee Fellowship. Any and all are invited to bring seeds, transplants, cuttings, seedlings, and/or established plants, to share and swap with fellow plant and garden enthusiasts! ## Reports and Updates from the Session...

### Repair of the Sanctuary Stained-Glass Window

Shortly after Christmas, the "Jesus Window" in the Sanctuary was vandalized by someone throwing rocks through it. Unfortunately, while we have video of the event, there is no way to identify who did it.



On the bright side, insurance will cover most of the cost of the repair. We have signed a contract with Helios Art Glass in Oakland to repair the window. They place scaffolding on the exterior of the window, remove the center section of the window and place plywood in the middle while the section is restored. The work is expected to take 4-6 weeks.

### Renewal of Transitional Pastor Contract

As our transitional pastor, Pastor Renée can only contract with the Session for up to one year at a time. The Session approved the renewal of Pastor Renée's contract at the March meeting. If the church finds a new pastor before the end of her contract, there are provisions in the contract to end her work earlier.



### Session Update on Budget

The Session met following the congregational meeting, where we explained the budget shortfall expected for this year. There are two efforts underway to respond: to look for further budget reductions, and to ask the congregation for further

contributions. A stewardship team, consisting of Faye Wilson, Jim Watts, and Chad Pennebaker has been formed for this latter effort. Look for a letter later this month from the team.



### Women's Weekend: Rooted and Reaching with Rev. Dr. Sandy Tice - April 19th-21st, 2024

This month FPC SL women will attend the Women's Weekend at Westminster Woods to rest and reflect, celebrate and sing, contemplate and lament, and be in community with one another. Rev. Dr. Sandy Tice, a retired Teaching Elder in the PCUSA, will be the speaker for the weekend this year. Sandy will help the group to embody Christ's Love in Action through inspirational speaker time and experiential worship. Using the image of the redwood forest as a guide, participants will explore biblical texts, prayer, and lived experience in order to hear God's invitation to flourish and grow. **The Cup of Our Life** — *Continuing Our Journey of Abundance with daily prayer and reflection*  
Begins Sunday April 7



How is your prayer life going? If you're like me, it goes in cycles, and sometimes I need a new focus to enrich my spiritual life. If you are at a place like this, or simply would like to try something different, you are invited to engage with Joyce Rupp's book *The Cup of Our Life*, which is a seven-week program for spiritual growth. Rupp uses the image of the cup as the container for our lives, and noticing that when our cup is full, it needs to be emptied so that something else can be put into it. The book is a guide for six weeks of prayer with a different focus each week. There are daily readings, invitations to meditation, prayers and questions for journaling and art.

**Solo journey:** Some of you may simply want to buy the book and follow the guide on your own.

### Sunday Morning Class: Begins April 7 for Seven Weeks in the Fireside Room

Some of you may find gathering each week for reflection with others on this journey a way to enrich your experience.

## Memories from Winter Camp at Calvin Crest

The last weekend of February a small group of students and adults from our church attended Winter Camp at Calvin Crest. Calvin Crest is a sister camp of Westminster Woods located at an elevation of 5,000 ft in the Sierra Mountains near Yosemite National Park. Unfortunately there was no snow except for that seen on the distant mountain tops but everyone still had a wonderful time. Our group of 2 middle schoolers, 2 high schoolers and 4 adults joined with groups of students and adults from 3-4 other churches to worship and learn together in large and small groups, share meals, explore God's creation, make crafts, hike, play games, and go zip-lining at night only after solving the camp-wide mystery of which character stole the zip-lining equipment and why.



The theme for the weekend was "WORTHY." Throughout the weekend the students looked at stories from the Gospel of Matthew about the Kingdom of God. They were challenged to consider, *What are you holding on to that is keeping you from grasping all that God has to offer you? What is one step you have taken toward God in the past year? What's one step you might be open to taking next? How do you feel that God sees you; do you feel worthy of God's love?* The weekend ended with Sunday worship and communion before everyone headed down the mountain and back home.

We tagged along on one of the treks through the woods and were made to feel part of the group by the kids and the counselors.
