

The Day of Pentecost

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues[a] as the Spirit enabled them. Acts 2:1-4

God sent the gift of the Holy Spirit to his people on the day of Pentecost. The Holy Spirit helped God's people to tell others about Jesus. It didn't even matter if they spoke the same language. They told others about Jesus and they understood. Thousands of people came to know Jesus on Pentecost and began the very first church, making Pentecost the Birthday of the church.



This year, Sunday, May 19, is Pentecost Sunday and everyone is encouraged to wear RED, the color of Pentecost. Faye Wilson will once again be coordinating the reading of scripture in many different languages within the morning worship service. Our church will also be participating in the Presbyterian Church (USA) Pentecost Offering that is used for children at risk and for ministry with youth and young adults. Our congregation will keep 40 percent of the offering for use here, and send the remainder to Presbytery and General Assembly for their use. The Cup of Our Life by Joyce Rupp is a six-week program for spiritual growth that uses the image of the cup as the container for our lives. This study invites us to pray for six weeks, creating a regular practice of prayer as a way to consistently nourish, restore and renew our relationship with God. When we take time to sit with God, read from his word, talk to God, and listen to God the more we get to know God, his Word and grow in our faith and relationship with him. Each week involves a different prayer experience that focuses on one aspect of the cup as a metaphor of spiritual growth. There are daily readings, meditation invitations, prayers and questions for journaling and art. In class each Sunday, participants share about their individual experiences throughout the week and further explore the metaphor of the cup.



All COVID **Protocols Lifted**


and Sunday Attendance **Stations Eliminated**

Update: Stained Glass Window Repairs

On Tuesday, April 2, two stain glass restoration experts from Helios Art Glass carefully removed the 6'x3' center damaged section of the "Jesus Window" in our main Sanctuary. While they are working to repair the damage to this section of the window, they have temporarily replaced it with a plywood "plug". The full repair and restoration of the window is expected to take 4-6 weeks. First the broken glass pieces will be replaced and the damaged pane repaired. Then a professional artist will repaint the image on the new glass. Once the window is fully restored, it will be re-installed in our sanctuary. Thankfully, we have already received an insurance payment that will cover most of the cost of the repair.

In addition to the "Jesus Window" Helios Art Glass also removed the center Butterfly and Easter Lily 2'x2' center of the Sharon Jones & Ted Hitchcock memorial window in the chapel. This window was vandalized (in a separate incident from the Jesus Window) by a single rock being thrown through it. Only one pane of glass in this window was damaged. Helios Art Glass will repair and return this window to its proper place in the chapel.

BEE-You-Tea


Saturday, May 18; 10 am in Fellowship Hall
