

## World Communion Sunday and Peace & Global Witness Offering

On Sunday October 6th, Christians all around the world will be celebrating World Communion Sunday. This is a Sunday where we celebrate our oneness in Christ around the table with believers everywhere.

This is also the Sunday when we will receive the Peace and Global Witness Offering, which supports our partners in the Presbyterian Church as they continue their efforts to be a part of God's peacemaking and witness throughout the world.



This offering strengthens collaboration with churches, mid councils, and mission partners all over the world. Together we support efforts to inspire, equip, and connect Presbyterians engaging in ministries of reconciliation and peace that respond to cultures of violence, including our own.

Twenty-five percent of collected funds stay with local congregations, such as ours. As always, congregations and mid councils determine how best to use those gifts to engage in peace work and global witness. Our church can choose to support local peacemaking initiatives or community-based ministries, or to offer assistance to immigrants, support a Presbyterian mission co-worker, or provide financial support to the Presbyterian Ministry at the United Nations.

This year, we again come together as we have been sent—from east and west, and from north and south—to proclaim and engage in ministries that witness to the peace of Christ in all the earth.

## **Heart to Heart Women's Ministry**

Last month 24 women came together for the first gathering of the all new Heart to Heart monthly ministry for women. The goal of Heart to Heart is to create a Christian community where



women connect with one another and seek the heart of God together as we study God's story and share our own stories of life and faith. Throughout the year, the monthly study will explore the character and story of two Biblical women, exploring who they were individually, then comparing and contrasting their character and their faith stories, as well as considering how they relate to each other and to us as we live our lives of faith.

Each month a different woman will also share *From the Heart* about her own personal story of how God is at work in her life. Additionally, between monthly gatherings women will have the opportunity to intentionally connect with a few other women to grow deeper in our relationships with one another.

At the first gathering the women enjoyed a delicious Italian Pasta Salad, with bread, butter and fruit, prepared and provided by Shari Plunkett. The study focused on Women of the Covenants: Sarah and Hagar. Kathy Pearson also shared some of her own personal faith story.

Heart to Heart takes place on the second Thursday of the month from 12:30 – 2:30 pm in the Fireside room.

The October gathering will take place on Thursday Oct. 10 with a light lunch prepared and provided by Linda Pollard. The October study will consider Sisters and Rivals: Rachel and Leah and we will hear as another woman shares *From the Heart*. ## SEEKING TO BE FAITHFUL TOGETHER:

Guidelines for Presbyterians in Times of Disagreement

#### In a spirit of trust and love, we promise we will...

## Give them a hearing... listen before we answer

(John 7:51 and Proverbs 18:13)

## 1. Treat each other respectfully so as to build trust, believing that we all desire to be faithful to Jesus the Christ;

- we will keep our conversations and communications open for candid and forthright exchange,
- we will not ask questions or make statements in a way that will intimidate or judge others.
- 2. Learn about various positions on the topic of disagreement.
- 3. State what we think we heard and ask for clarification before responding, in an effort to be sure we understand each other.

## Speak the truth in love

(Ephesians 4:15)

- 4. Share our concerns directly with individuals or groups with whom we have disagreements in a spirit of love and respect in keeping with Jesus' teachings.
- Focus on ideas and suggestions instead of questioning people's motives, intelligence or integrity;
  - we will not engage in name-calling or labeling of others prior to, during or following the discussion.
- 6. Share our personal experiences about the subject of disagreement so that others may more fully understand our concerns.
- 7. Indicate where we agree with those of other viewpoints as well as where we disagree.
- 8. Seek to stay in community with each other though the discussion may be vigorous and full of tension;
  - we will be ready to forgive and be forgiven.

## 9. Follow these additional guidelines when we meet in decision-making bodies:

- urge people of various points of view to speak and promise to listen to these positions seriously;
- seek conclusions informed by our points of agreement;
- be sensitive to the feelings and concerns of those who do not agree with the majority and respect their rights of conscience;
- abide by the decision of the majority, and if we disagree with it and wish to change it, work for that change in ways that are consistent with these Guidelines.
- 10. Include our disagreement in our prayers, not praying for the triumph of our viewpoints, but seeking God's grace to listen attentively, to speak clearly and to remain open to the vision God holds for us all.

Maintain the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace (Ephesians 4:3)

Saturday, October 12


