From everyone's viewpoint (diverse to be sure), there is a lot at stake for the wellbeing of our lives, our families, our communities, and our world. I believe that it is an important time to be

talking about "doing unto others" in ways that we hope will foster kindness, compassion, humility, peacemaking, respect, and love in the world.

As Christians, we have enough humility to know that we don't have all the answers, but thankfully we do have the teachings of Jesus, who lived in his own turbulent times. And there are lessons for us in them – in the ways that he invited us to focus on treating others in generous ways – because we know first-hand what it's like to receive that kind of love.

This committee will conduct the search for our next called Pastor and will present a single candidate to the congregation for consideration. Immediately following their election, the members of the PNC were commissioned by Pastor Renee who told them "The duty sounds simple, but the task is arduous. [You] have been called to a demanding task to seek out the next leader of this congregation. While it is a demanding task, it is also one filled with the possibility of spiritual growth and gifts of community along the way."

The PNC, consisting of Ben Ball, Gil DeHoyos, Sue Goodnow, Brian Hickey, Conrad Milner, Sue Robertson, Jennifer Spadoni and Mary Woolsey, has already begun to organize themselves, in preparation for the task set before them.

Some of the work of this committee is necessarily confidential. While they can report on their process and the paperwork about the pastor position is public, as they get deeper into their work, they will need to operate with strict confidentiality as they engage with candidates. 100th Anniversary of First Presbyterian Building located at 180 Estudillo Ave.

The year 2025 will be the 100th anniversary of the current First Presbyterian Church building at 180 Estudillo Ave. in San Leandro, CA. The cornerstone of the building was laid on June 21, 1925 and the building was dedicated on November 22, 1925.

The session voted at the August meeting to approve an ad-hoc committee be formed to plan celebrations throughout 2025



that will not only mark the 100 year building anniversary but also strengthen the relationship between our church and the community; improve the image of our church and its facilities within the community; increase our involvement with the local community. A committee is already being formed and Lou Pennebaker will serve as the Staff liaison.

Fixing Up Our Buildings & Grounds

The Administration Team has worked to remove rocks and repair our broken windows in the Peak Room along Estudillo. A number of the windows had been broken by unknown people throwing rocks through them.
