Cheryl Perenon. The study focused on Sisters and Rivals: Rachel & Leah, and Dolores McLeod shared parts of her own personal life/faith story.



# A NOTE FROM THE FINANCIAL ELDERS

Over the last several months, Session has been assessing both this year's and next year's spending. The good news is that through the generous giving of the congregation this year, an anticipated change in how we account for depreciation, and a net reduction in actual spending, we expect our cash income and expenditures for 2024 to be close to breakeven.

The church will likely return to a cash basis of accounting for its fixed assets and leasehold improvements. Under this method, the church will expense assets when they are paid for and will no longer recognize depreciation expenses. This is an acceptable method of accounting for churches.

The net reduction in 2024 spending is in spite of the fact that Session increased the Administrative Manager's hours effective Sept. 16, to allow her time to cover additional duties in accounting, communications and publicity.

The Session has already begun to look at 2025's operating budget. 2025 will be a transition year as we expect a new pastor to arrive during the summer. We are working to set our priorities so that as we ask you, the congregation, for your support, you know the mission and ministries that we feel God is calling us to support.

While there are challenges in the upcoming year, we know God has blessed us and provided for this church more times than we can count. We will endeavor to discern what choices need to be made to set First Presbyterian on the best path for its future.

Session is in receipt of a number of letters suggesting ways to move forward. We know that there are various opinions about staffing and the use of reserve funds and undesignated funds to cover operating expenses. Be assured that Session is aware of all of these suggestions and is actively considering what can and should be done. All of the suggested "solutions" have their advocates in Session.


